Through Rotary Community Groups, clubs will work together to increase their impact, boost their membership and build their public profile.

This form marks the beginning of your club's journey to becoming part of a Rotary Community Group with other clubs.

In this form, you will be able to specify:

- The **primary** way you would like to be grouped with other clubs, based on commonalities such as geography, type of club (e.g. online club) or a shared language (e.g. French). A club can only be part of **one** primary grouping.
- If you would like to be placed in a **secondary** grouping, an informal online network based on a shared interest. A club can participate in **more than one** secondary group.

Once established, each primary Rotary Community Group will elect its own Rotary Community Leader. Rotary Community Leaders will personally provide support or access specialist support for the clubs in their group. Further information about how Rotary Community Leaders will be elected will be available once Rotary Community Groups have been formed.

Please note Rotary Community Groups will need to engage with District teams in relation to functions and activities that will remain with Districts, such as contributions to and grants from The Rotary Foundation.

In collaboration with District leaders, the Regionalisation team will use the information provided in this form to group clubs, accommodating your preferences as much as possible.

Please discuss the questions in this form with your club members to ensure you are representing the majority views of your club.
